
CLASSES & EVENTS FEBRUARY

Wright's "Romans for Everyone" as a guide, the Rev. Richard Marsden leads the class through a fascinating study of this most significant piece of God's revealed words.

TUESDAYS 8 February – 1 March 6:30 PM or WEDNESDAYS 9 February – 2 March 10:30 AM or SATURDAYS 19 February 1:00 - 4:00 PM

This four-week course is designed to expand understanding of how best to plan for and achieve financial and material health – as seen through the essential perspective of spiritual wealth.



Presented by parishioner Raul Elizalde, topics will range from "Money in Context with Our Spiritual Life" (with Fr. Robinson joining), to "Avoiding Investment Risk," and "Achieving your Financial Goals." Except for the Saturday event, all classes will last one hour. Raul is a financial investment expert who has been guoted in media such as The Wall Street Journal and Bloomberg TV.

THE REV. ALAN W. HANSEN

Sunday, 13 February

The Rev. Alan W. Hansen will preach at all morning masses and make a presentation to the parish both during the 10:15 Rector's Class, and in an extended afternoon session (3 to 4:45 p.m.) where he will talk about life cycles in churches, "Restoring the Gates," and leadership.

The Rev. Hansen is president of Acts29Ministries – a premier Christian resource force for discipleship, renewal and ministry in the Power of the Holy Spirit, which bases its teaching on "what we have actually done in church ministry... Our goal is to move people into ministry. We want to see people get out of the "spectator" mode and onto the playing field." Don't miss this exciting opportunity to hear The Rev. Hansen speak.

THE ERA OF REFORMATION

THURSDAY mornings 10:30 / evenings 6:30

Beginning Thursday 17 February for four weeks, Dr. Stuart Prall offers a dynamic study of "The Late Medieval and Renaissance Church," "Free Will," "Faith and Good Works," "Luther and the 95 Theses," "John Calvin and the Institutes," and "England - the Via Media." Dr. Prall is the author of several books including "Church and State in Tudor and Stuart England," and "The Puritan Revolution and the English Civil War." He has been a Margaret Thatcher Lecturer at the University of Tel-Aviv, and is Professor Emeritus of History at Queens College, City University of New York. He took his Ph.D. from Columbia University, and was a Fulbright Scholar at the University of Manchester, England.

This eight-week, evening series begins Tuesday, 22 February, and is specifically for those adults who are new to the Christian Faith, new to the Church of the Redeemer, or who desire a refresher on what it means to be a Christian in the Anglican tradition.

This insightful, educational and spiritually enriching class is typically led by Father Robinson, and is a basic requirement for all adults who


desire to be confirmed or received at Redeemer.

MORAL THEOLOGY

Sunday, 6 March

Dr. Stanley Hauerwas, noted Christian theologian and Duke University ethicist, will discuss Moral Theology at 7 p.m., in Gillespie Hall. "Every major issue facing us as a society is a moral issue in one way or another," says the Rev. Fredrick Robinson.



"War, the environment, human sexuality, to name a few, are all issues with moral implications. To ignore the moral elements of these issues is to miss the heart of the matter. Stanley Hauerwas is a moral theologian who has devoted his life to the study of current issues and how they relate to Christian moral teaching. He has gained an international reputation for his well-reasoned and articulate discussions of 21st century issues. You won't want to miss this engaging speaker."

THE TEN COMMANDMENTS

mornings 10:30 / evenings 6:30 9 March through 13 April

The Rev. Lance Wallace leads this Lenten study of "How Jesus Transforms the Ten Commandments," examining questions such as what did Jesus mean when he said, 'I have not come to abolish the law, but to fulfill the law?' and what purpose do the Ten Commandments have in our everyday life? Throughout Christian history, the Church has vacillated between graceless legalism and lawless license.



This study will guide us between those two besetting errors. Edmund Clowney's book, How Jesus Transforms the Ten Commandments will be the study guide.

CLASSIC THEOLOGY

St. Thomas Aguinas - Master Theologian WEDNESDAY mornings 10:30 / evenings 6:30

Beginning Wednesday, 16 March, Charles B. Axton II, Ph.D., will present a five-week study and assessment of the influence of St. Thomas Aguinas – the prolific 13th century writer and theologian considered to be the foremost classical proponent of natural theology and the father of the Thomistic school of philosophy and theology.

This class will cover the encounter between Christianity and the Hellenization of the last half of the 13th century, as well as review Aguinas' two best known and major works – Summa Contra Gentiles, and Summa Theologica.

In 2000, Dr. Axton was honored by Washburn University College of Arts & Sciences as an Alumni Fellow, in acknowledgement for his distinguished career. Dr. Axton received his Masters of Arts and Ph.D. from the University of Kansas and was Dean and Professor of Music and Philosophy at Schiller College in Germany.


